



Karen M. Garrison Retired President, Pitney Bowes Business Services



Karen Garrison served as president of Pitney Bowes Business Services from 1999 until her retirement in 2004, leading the organization through its most significant growth period, as it grew from \$576 million in revenue to \$1.3 billion in 2004. She is also credited with the successful acquisition and integration of Danka Services International, Shell Services International and DDD Company during her tenure.

From 1978 to 1999, Ms. Garrison held a number of positions of increasing responsibility at Pitney Bowes and Dictaphone Corporation (then a subsidiary of Pitney Bowes), including vice president of operations, vice president of finance and chief financial officer.

Ms. Garrison serves on the boards of three public companies: Tenet Healthcare Corporation (NYSE:THC), Kaman Corporation (NYSE:KAMN) and Standard Parking Corp. (NASDAQ:STAN).

Ms. Garrison has served on the boards of Girl Scout organizations in communities where she has lived and is also a member of the *Committee of 200*, an invitation-only group of the world's most successful female entrepreneurs and corporate leaders whose primary mission is to advance women's leadership in business.

Ms. Garrison holds a bachelor's of science degree in accounting from Rollins College and a master's degree in business administration from the Florida Institute of Technology.

Ms. Garrison was elected to Tenet's board of directors in March 2005. She is a member of the Nominating and Corporate Governance Committee and the Audit Committee.
